ORDINANCE NO. 23-2011
(Sponsor - Councilmember Shasky)

AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE (ORDINANCE NUMBER 1-91, PART 12, TITLE 6) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO TO CHANGE PERMANENT PARCEL NUMBERS ON MACK AVENUE, PARK AVENUE AND HIGH SCHOOL AVENUE WHICH ARE DESIGNATED AS I-2 (HEAVY INDUSTRIAL AND MANUFACTURING DISTRICT) TO B-2 (CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT).

WHEREAS, by authority of Codified Ordinances 1260 05, the Council of the City of Shelby has determined that certain permanent parcel numbers on Mack Avenue, Park Avenue and High School Avenue as located within an I-2 (Heavy Industrial and Manufacturing District) should be zoned as B-2 (Central Business District) property, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Shelby has reviewed the proposed amendment and has approved of same on August 2, 2011, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Codified Ordinance 1260.05 the Council of the City of Shelby has determined that said amendment to the Zoning Ordinance is necessary, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with mandates of the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Shelby, a public hearing shall be held concerning this proposed amendment, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that Ordinance number 1-91, Part 12, Title 6 be amended and that certain Richland County permanent parcel numbers on Mack Avenue, Park Avenue and High School Avenue be rezoned, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the zoning map attached to Ordinance Number 1-91 as passed on March 4, 1991 (with amendments) is hereby revised and amended by changing the following Richland County Permanent Parcel Numbers 0460815915000, 0460815913000, 0460818611000, 0460818614000, 0460818613000, 0460806407000, 0460818612000, 0460815914000, 0460815917000 and 0490818610000 from I-2 (Heavy Industrial and Manufacturing District) to B-2 (Central Business District)

Section 2: That the Clerk of Council and the Chairman of the Shelby Planning Commission are directed to make the necessary changes on the original zoning map of the City of Shelby, Ohio

Section 3: That all other zones and designations currently on said map are to remain in full force and effect.

Section 4: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220 01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121 22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.



ADOPTING THE ROTH 457 OPTION AS AN ELECTIVE DEFERRAL TO ALL EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SHELBY WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FIRE FIGHTERS LOCAL 2492.

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby adopted and instituted The Ohio Association of Professional Fire Fighters 457 Deferred Compensation Plan by Resolution No. 69-2001 on August 6, 2001, and

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby chooses to amend its participation in said plan by adopting the Roth Elective Deferral, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that the City of Shelby, Ohio amend and alter it's participation in the Ohio Association of Professional Fire Fighters 457 Deferred Compensation Plan by adding the Roth Elective Deferral, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the City of Shelby, Ohio hereby adopts the amendment to the Ohio Association of Professional Fire Fighters 457 Deferred Compensation Plan which allows and incorporates the Roth Elective Deferral .

Section 2: That the Finance Director of the City of Shelby, Ohio shall take any and all necessary action to implement the Roth Elective Deferral and to make it available to employees of the City of Shelby who are members of the International Association of Fire Fighters Local 2492.

Section 3: That consistent with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Board as associated with the amendment allowing the Roth Elective Deferral, the proper officials, officers, employees, and agents of the City of Shelby, Ohio are authorized to provide the Board with any information they may properly require for the administration of the Plan under the amended Program.

Section 4: That the amended deferred compensation program referred to herein (including the Roth Elective Deferral) and administered by the Ohio Association of Professional Fire Fighters Deferred Compensation Board shall be available as a deferred compensation option to all employees of the City of Shelby who are members of the International Association of Fire Fighters Local 2492 within sixty days of the passage of this resolution

Section 5: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Resolution have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio

Section 7: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.





DECLARING THAT CERTAIN SIDEWALKS WITHIN THE CITY OF SHELBY SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED AND/OR REPAIRED.

WHEREAS, Section 94 of the Charter of the City of Shelby authorizes the City Council to declare by resolution that "certain specified sidewalks, curbing, or gutters shall be constructed or repaired", and

WHEREAS, certain sidewalks exist within the City of Shelby which have not been properly maintained by the owners thereof and which, therefore, require the mandatory construction and/or repair as ordered by Council by virtue of the authority contained within Section 94 of the Charter of the City of Shelby, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that the City Council declare that certain specified sidewalks as set forth herein be constructed and/or repaired according to the terms and conditions of Section 94 of the Charter of the City of Shelby, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the sidewalks specified herein below are to be constructed and/or repaired in accordance with Section 94 of the Charter of the City of Shelby.

Section 2: Upon the passage of this resolution, the Clerk of Council shall cause written notice of the passage thereof to be served upon the owner, or agent of the owner, of each parcel of land abutting upon those sidewalks which are contiguous to the property addresses set forth hereinabove and said written notice shall be served in the manner provided by law for the service of summons in civil actions

Section 3: If the sidewalks are not constructed and/or repaired to the satisfaction of the Mayor of the City of Shelby or her designee within 30 days of the service of the notice, the Mayor may proceed to have said sidewalks constructed and/or repaired at the expense of the owner.

Section 4: In the event that the City of Shelby is required to undertake the construction and/or repair of the sidewalks or to enter into a contract therefore, the Council of the City of Shelby shall pass an ordinance assessing the cost and expense thereof upon the property owners in accordance with the terms of Section 94 of the Charter of the City of Shelby.

Section : That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Resolution have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.







AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AS DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE PURCHASE OF ROCK SALT.

WHEREAS, the Richland County Board of Commissioners and the Richland County Engineer are willing to partner with the City of Shelby in purchasing rock salt in the hopes that the combined, larger purchase will be at a lesser cost than if purchased independently, and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code 125.04 authorizes political subdivisions to purchase supplies or services from one another as long as said purchase is on equivalent terms, conditions, and specifications (but at a lower price) than could be purchased by bidding or through the state cooperative purchase plan, and

WHEREAS, the Richland County Board of Commissions and the Richland County Engineer are prepared to undertake the necessary steps to purchase rock salt for both the County and City of Shelby all in accordance with the terms of the Ohio Revised Code and, specifically, 125.04, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that the Mayor as Director of Public Service be authorized to enter into a contract with the Richland County Board of Commissioners for the purchase of rock salt, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the Mayor as Director of Public Service be authorized to enter into a contract with the Richland County Board of Commissioners for the purchase of rock salt.




